


White

raft race
a slow boat
to Broad
Ripple







Rain failed to wash away the enthusiasm o 8,000 rafters of 30,000 spectators Sunday as the second annual raft racemoved on a slick course from the Landings Apartments to Broad RipplePark.

More than 1,152 home made rafts, boats and potoons carried some 8,000 participats along the 2.5 mile White River course that sponsoring WNAP radio pokesman described as "slick because of the heavy rain falling on the seenth turn."

But the drizles didn't dampen the enthusiasm of the more than 30,000 persons who logged Keystone Ave., and Broad Rpple Park in hopes of glimpsing the contest.

Due to tehnical trouble, results weren't available at press time. Radio station spokemen said they hoped to determine the vinners by Wednesday afternoon.

Commercia entries drew the most comment. Vicoria Station entered a locomotive carying 20 or 30 people. It was painted "ake a train to Hawaii," and named 'Spirit of White River." The Godfathr's entry featured a large bar in he middle, with girls in bikinis waiting on stools. Friday's raft was less advinturous this year than last year, bt was obviously more seaworthy.

Shark raft temes were popular, especially one nolded figure of a shark with its mound open and gaping teeth draped withnasty red stuff. One man nestled insie and kicked to propel himself down river.
